 10. Fire		 Old Wolves	Timberwolves may be taught how to start a fire under supervision of an Old Wolf (adult leader), but they do not carry matches or lighters



Do not bring a knife to camp or a meeting even if you have your Whittler Award unless approved by your Akela or an Old Wolf. Even if you have earned this safety award you must still have an adult's approval and supervision to have your knife out (even if the blade is closed). At camp all knives must be given to an adult when not in use.

Timberwolves need to pack their own bags so that they know what to bring and where things are. Other things may be carried as well if the Timberwolf chooses.

- Binoculars, Magnifying glass, Hacky sack or frisbee, Water toys, Interpretive field guides (flowers, insects), Star chart, Kites, and Compass are all useful.
- Extra clothing to consider are swim clothes, extra layers for cold weather, and water resistant closed toed shoes. Clothing should be moisture wicking non-cotton if cool weather.
- At camp consider a folding chair
- Please Leave at Home: Electronic games, Personal non-group toys, Painfully bright lights

The use of a "Scout Box" or "Scout Bag" helps keep everything in one place when not at a meeting. Not all the items will be used on every outing, but the Timberwolf will better appreciate the motto "Be Prepared" when they are indeed needed.
